

#### ANNUAL MEETING MINUTES February 6. 2022 for the Year 2021

The meeting (in person and via Zoom technology) was called to order by Senior Warden Bill Carle and Father. David Lynch at 11:09 AM. A quorum in accordance with the church by-laws [at least one-fourth of the Average Sunday Attendance recorded in the Parochial Report filed for the most recently filed calendar year] was certified. An opening prayer by Fr. David Lynch, and a remembrance of the faithfully departed, particularly Alexis Erin Forrest, Paula Jo "Jodie" Kavanaugh, Louis Francis "Lucky" Lux, Ian "Mac" McIntosh, and Kathryn Elizabeth Stewart, was offered. Elaine Marshall was elected clerk for the meeting by voice vote. The minutes from the January 31, 2021, contained in the Annual Report (SEE ATTACHED) were approved by voice vote following a motion and second. It was reported year 2021 resulted in no confirmations or baptisms.

Retiring Vestry members are Gabe Conn, Dr. Tess Garcia, and David Henson. Gabe Conn and David Henson agreed to serve another term. Mary Liddle was elected to the Vestry through voice vote following a motion and second. Dr. Garcia was thanked for her service to the Vestry and the parish

The election of Delegates to the Diocesan Convention, Deanery Council and Clericus meetings was the next order of business Fr. David and Bill Carle have agreed to be Diocesan delegates. Jim Gilligan, John Biggs and Fr. David will serve on the Deanery Council and attend Clericus meetings. Fr. David reminded everyone that the meetings are open.

Rector's, Senior Warden and Junior Warden Reports (SEE ATTACHED) The Rector's and both Wardens' Reports are included in the Annual Report.

Fr. David thanked the Vestry and congregation for their support during what has been a difficult year. He recognized new members to our congregation: Kim and Tim Culver, Marie and Ron Weisbach, Idida and Joaquin Perez and Bill Noone. He discussed his meetings with Provisional Bishop Rt. Rev. Diane Jardine Bruce. He continues to reach out to shut-ins by phone or in person whenever possible. He also discussed his retirement plans which are still in the consideration stage. Additionally, he hopes to raise a deacon candidate from the parish.

Sr. Warden Bill Carle started by thanking everyone for their help in working with the equipment which broadcasts our services. The new Vestry was introduced. He also recognized John Biggs for his service as Sr. Warden Pro-Tem while he was undergoing medical treatment. He presented John with a "Lifesaver Award."

Jr. Warden Les Woodward discussed the continuing efforts it takes to maintain our 50+ year old building in good condition. He also discussed the status of the addition to our narthex and installation of a lift. He is in on-going discussions with the contractor. The prices of supplies continue to increase so securing a definitive bid is difficult. He hopes for March/April start for construction. Installation of playground equipment will not take place until the completion of construction.

Sr. Warden Bill Carle recognized the leaders of our Ministry and Small Groups. Their reports are included in the Annual Report. Each group is open to new people joining them.

Stewardship Report (SEE ATTACHED) Treasurer Jim Gilligan reported on the stewardship efforts for 2022 resulted in 45 pledges, averaging \$3,456. There were 2 new pledges with 3 dropped pledges. 2022 pledges were \$152,076. Contributions continued even during the time we were unable to meet in person.

2021 Financial Statements and 2022 Budget (SEE AT-TACHED) The Treasurer briefly reviewed the 2021 financial statements and the 2022 budget. The proposed 2022 budget reflects the change in the apportionment to the Diocese. He discussed the Capital Campaign for the narthex addition. We have received a grant of \$15,000 from Diocese and, if needed, will be able to secure a no-interest loan from them. After discussion, a motion duly made and seconded the treasurer's report, including the budget, was approved by voice vote.

There was no New Business for discussion. There being no further old or new business, Fr. David offered a closing prayer and the meeting was adjourned at 12:50 PM.

#### INTERIM CLERGY REPORT The Rev. Dr. Douglas P. Johnson +

Grace to you and peace in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. I'm sitting at my desk striving to collect my thoughts as I'm also reflecting a bit about our Christmas celebrations. Christmas and Annual Meetings seem to come and follow each other with such rapid succession that we often don't slow down enough to just enjoy what God is doing, what God has done, and yes ---what God can still do among us.

I have loved being your priest at the Episcopal Church of the Resurrection. Being in the part-time kind of relationship that we have, well sometimes expectations can get jumbled a bit --- meaning that sometimes you might expect something of your priest that he's not able to give in the way a full-time rector might. I'm happy to say that, at least from my end of things, I haven't felt stress here. Instead, what I have seen is our parish leadership show themselves to be true leaders. They don't wait for me to figure out what to do next. Instead, your leadership (Vestry as well as many others), while they keep me up to date, they move forward on their own on a variety of fronts. We have seen this especially with the work which has been done in pastoral care, outreach, music, DOK, bible study, planning, financial management, being mission minded, and so much more.

I believe that one of the major things we have learned during this time of transition is our interdependent nature. Change has happened and some more change in our life is likely to occur as well. If and when those times come, please have patience, remember the love you have for one another, the ministry in our Lord's name that we all share, and the grace of God that surrounds us all.

We are blessed with a hard-working Vestry which offers their heart and soul to God through the ministry of this community of faith. I thank God for each of them in my daily prayers and commend them to your prayers as well. I am so thankful for the Search Committee and the important work they are doing. My own faith tells me that God has already set aside that person he is calling to be your next rector. The Search Committee's task, as well as the Vestry and by extension each member of this congregation, is to discern who exactly that person may be. So.....you can see why this work is so incredibly important. Many thanks to Bill Carle, to Jim Gilligan and to so many other faithful leaders who help to lead this congregation in doing the. Work God has called us to do.

In the meantime, please know that I love being your priest. If any pastoral concern comes up, please don't hesitate to contact me. #### **SR. WARDEN REPORT** Bill Carle

Each year brings Resurrection a new set of challenges and changes and 2022 was no exception. In April, Fr. David Lynch announced his intention to retire as of October 1. His last Sunday at Resurrection on September 25 was celebrated with one service and a luncheon. Fr. David began his ministry at our parish on January 1, 2016, and served as Resurrection's 4th Rector for almost seven years. Fr. David's energy and love will be sorely missed at Resurrection. We wish David and Debbie happiness in their new adventures in life.

In May, the Vestry authorized the creation of a Search Committee to be lead by Jim Gilligan with guidance from Fr. Chas Marks, Transition Missioner, from the Diocese of West Missouri. The nine members of this committee should be commended for their hard work and gift of their time as they travel the required steps in the search process. Please see the report of the Search Committee later in this Annual Report.

Resurrection has been blessed to have Fr. Doug Johnson lead our Sunday services while the search process proceeds. In addition to celebrating the Eucharist at both weekly services, Fr. Doug has provided pastoral care as only a long-time friend of the parish can do.

At our February 6, 2022, Annual Meeting, Mary Liddle was newly-elected to the Vestry while Gabe Conn and David Henson were elected to serve additional 3-year terms. Vestry members completing their 3-year terms in January 2023, include Bill Carle, Jim Gilligan and Les Woodward. Returning members include Diane Gerlach, Joe Owen and Jan Pahlas. Monthly vestry meetings were attended both in-person and via Zoom software.

Despite ongoing concerns regarding the Covid-19 pandemic, parishioners joined in fellowship and worship for ecumenical services, parish dinners and numerous other functions. The Outreach Committee (the pride and joy of Resurrection) not only continued their Christian service but grew their mission during 2022.

Before Fr. David's retirement, The Rt. Rev. Diane M. Jardine Bruce, Bishop Provisional of the Diocese of West Missouri, joined Resurrection on September 23

for the Confirmation and Reception of Tim and Kim Culver, Lane Vermillion and Steven Dudley. Bishop Diane also celebrated the 9:30am service on December 11 as part of her annual visitation to Resurrection. Mollie Quinn Conn, daughter of Jason and Jodi Conn, was baptized on April 16, 2022.

Resurrection's finances remained strong in 2022 as parishioners stayed current with their annual pledges and Capital Campaign commitments. We continued to work with our architect and contractors to arrive at a starting point for construction of our expanded Narthex.

Weekly attendance in 2022 had not recovered to prepandemic levels, but slowly increased with the introduction of vaccines and the relaxation of restrictions on socializing. Sunday services continued to be livebroadcast on FaceBook and YouTube.

The single constant from year to year at Resurrection remains the hard work and dedication of our laity. It takes many people, most wearing many hats, to accomplish all the wonderful work of our parish. #### **JR. WARDEN REPORT** Les Woodward

With church getting back to something normal after Covid, items around the church need to be addressed as usage increases. As I have said in the past, I feel the exterior of our building has character, but like anything that is used it takes work to keep anything looking good. So, to anyone who took the time to work inside or on the exterior of the building, the church thanks you.

Major items that were completed in the year gone.

- 1. Cleaned and painted the front hand rail and the big cross at the front of the building.
- 2. Stripped the red front doors and repainted.
- 3. In the undercroft, all the old light fixtures were removed and new LED fixtures installed. Part of the cost of the fixtures will be made up by no maintenance requirements and operating cost savings.
- 4. This Christmas eve there was a problem with the two furnaces which heat the sanctuary and the undercroft. By the time I arrived the temperature was 35 degrees in the sanctuary. The furnace problems were corrected. The residual effect of the cold temperatures in the kitchen area were frozen water pipes which were dealt with in-house.
- 5. The double-doors near the columbarium were repaired.
- 6. The Sacristy got new flooring and repainted walls.

The routine problems were dealt with very little work required from outside contractors which helps to keep the costs down.

Thanks to the generosity of our congregation, the Outreach Ministries have continued to help many. Special thanks go to Elaine Gilligan in her effort to obtain a Jubilee grant of \$750 to aide in our efforts.

Necessity Pantry – The pantry continues to serve many in need. The toiletries pantry continues during these times in partnership with the Independence Community Services League food pantry. Our contributions also help to provide toiletries.

Back Snack – Our Back Snack angels have done an excellent job continuing with this much needed ministry. Currently, we are serving 23 children at Thomas Ultican on a weekly basis. Community Services League – Melodie Chrisman and her team of angels continue to adapt to ever changing protocols. Our congregation has been every present in the calls for assistance including: school supplies, collection of food items throughout the year, gift donations for the Christmas Store, parishioners volunteering at the Christmas Store, collection of knitted hats, scarves and mittens. When we receive a call from Melodie we get the word out and our parishioners are always generous in their efforts to help.

Blessing Bags – We continue to provide Blessing Bags to be handed out to those in need. As we have adapted to Covid and are getting out more than in the year past, there has been an increase in the delivery of Blessing Bags. Grab a bag and have it in your car to pass out.

There has also been a huge response from our congregation on items needed for the apartment such as pillows, blankets and silverware. #### PARISH LIFE Bill Carle

The Parish Life Committee coordinates and schedules the congregation's social and spiritual activities as well as the use of the church building and grounds. Led by the Rector, Bill Carle and Elaine Gilligan, this committee met with the leadership of our various parish ministries in January and July of 2022 to set the church calendar and to improve communication and support of our programs.

Although precautions surrounding the Coronavirus pandemic remained, Resurrection's parishioners managed to celebrate services and fellowship together. Church services were broadcast online via Facebook and YouTube on a regular basis. Sunday attendance slowly increased during the year and we joined the annual Lenten Ecumenical Services.

Parish activities that continued on a limited basis included bingo, game and movie nights and meetings of the Finding Faith Through Fiction book club, the Ladies' Lunch Bunch, our Wednesday Bible Study Group, and the Daughters of the King. During the first half of 2022, we hosted Girl Scout Troop 3318 two evenings each month and the Growing Hearts and Minds school each Monday.

Jim and Elaine Gilligan hosted a Newcomers' Welcome Reception in June. Elaine continued her ministry of delivering coffee mugs to the homes of first time Sunday visitors. An updated parish directory was distributed in October.

With Fr David Lynch's retirement in late September, Fr Doug Johnson presided at the October 8 Blessing of the Animals. The annual bonfire at the Biggs' homestead was also held on October 8. A few dedicated parishioners earned significant funds for the church by directing event parking at Grace & Holy Trinity Cathedral during 2022.

Other activities included the St Patrick's and Shrove Tuesday Dinners, informal Friday gatherings at Vito's Pizza in Blue Springs, and a very successful yard sale on May 13-14. Dr Bill Stancil joined us for two adult forums in March. Our famous first-Sunday pancake breakfasts resumed in September.

A highlight of 2022 was when twenty parishioners traveled to the cathedral to view the nativity puppet show in early December.

Resurrection's biggest get-together was our farewell service and luncheon for Fr David Lynch on September 25. With Lisa and Chad Twitty providing the tasty brisket, approximately seventy parishioners, family and friends joined to wish David and Debbie a happy retirement.

We look forward to 2023 to see what glorious colors abound and that the fruits of our labors flourish and continue to grace the landscape of our church. A great street presence is as important as a warm welcome at the door. We will continue to formulate the expansion of the memorial garden on the west side of the church. We'll move the stone baptismal font to the new area since it will be displaced by the new addition.

We would love to have others help us. Even if you don't know much about plants, there are many other jobs to assist with; especially maintenance.

Suggestions from the parish are always welcome. If you have any thoughts about the garden areas, please speak to any member of the committee.

We hope to see you in the Spring when new projects develop.

#### **COLUMBARIUM & MEMORIAL GARDEN** Bill Carle

The Vestry-authorized Columbarium Board consists of five members of the Church. The Senior Warden serves as Chair of the Board while the Rector serves on the Board and appoints the remaining three members (each serving a three-year term). With the retirement of Father David Lynch, current members include Sr Warden Bill Carle, Mary Liddle (term through January 2025), Elaine Gilligan (through January 2026) and John Biggs (through January 2024). Board members held their mandatory annual meeting on November 13, 2022.

The purchase of a Right to Inurnment in the columbarium is priced at \$1,500. It is important to note that all funds received from the sale of Rights to Inurnment are separately accounted for and maintained as a restricted account for Columbarium purposes. Twenty-three of the forty niches have been reserved as of the end of 2022. Parishioners interested in the purchase of a Right to Inurnment should speak with a Board Member.

In 2022, services of inurnment were held for Gene Dexter and Ruth Lux.

The Board also oversees the parish outdoor Memorial Garden. A \$350 Interment Fee includes a memorial service for the in-ground burial of cremains, an engraved nameplate on the Memorial Plaque and maintenance as long as the Memorial Garden exists. In 2022, no services for the burial of ashes were held.



#### CAPITAL CAMPAIGN REPORT Bill Carle

At their September 15, 2021 meeting, the Vestry voted to proceed with the effort to expand and modernize the parish narthex. A 3-year Capital Campaign was authorized to finance this project. Forty households pledged a total of \$226,660. Additionally, Resurrection received a \$15,000 grant from the Diocese of West Missouri. During 2022, over \$53,000 in pledged donations were received resulting in a year-end balance of \$186,477 for the Capital Campaign.

As always, the top priority of your vestry is to protect the financial security of the parish. If needed, we expect to obtain a very low-interest construction loan from the diocese to fund the project using pledges as collateral.

The Vestry appreciates the generosity, confidence and patience our parishioners have shown during the past year. Resurrection leadership continues to work with local contractors and our architect to finalize construction plans. We hope to begin construction in the next few months.



#### FR. DAVID R. LYNCH + Our 4th Rector

The Vestry announced it had called Father David Lynch as the 4th Rector of the Church of the Resurrection on November 29, 2015. Father Lynch began his ministry at Resurrection on January 1, 2016.

Father Lynch's love of music and his formal training as a vocalist, gently moved the parish to significantly improve its music program. The choir was bolstered with additional voices and the congregation undertook a fund raising campaign to replace its aging organ. The new instrument was first played in church services on January 20, 2019.

In what turned out to be a very visionary move, Resurrection installed a live-streaming video system in the Church in early 2020, right before the COVID-19 pandemic caused in-person church services to be halted for many months. The video was and continues to be broadcast on YouTube and FaceBook.

In the summer of 2021, Resurrection undertook a follow-up capital campaign to raise money to construct an addition to the church building that would allow for the relocation of a set of steep stairs between the floors as well as a wheelchair lift. The project would have the secondary benefit of enlarging the narthex by 50 square feet. Parishioners again responded generously, pledging approximately \$225,000 with a majority of the money given up-front. The Vestry of the Church of the Resurrection has since approved construction of the project and completion is estimated by the end of 2023.

In April of 2022, Father David Lynch announced his intention to retire from active ministry on September 30, 2022. Resurrection celebrated Fr. David's last Sunday with the congregation on Sunday, September 28, 2022. We give thanks and praise for the ministry of Fr. David and his wife Debbie and wish them both a very, happy retirement!

# Rector Search Committee

The Search Committee is charged by the Vestry to find and recommend one final candidate to the Vestry for the position of Rector of the Church of the Resurrection. The Vestry has the final decision to elect and call the new Rector. The call itself is issued by the Bishop or Ecclesiastical Authority of the Diocese. The search process is confidential, and the Parish will be made aware of the name of the new Rector once the Vestry has voted, the Bishop has issued the call and it has been accepted by the candidate.

The entire search process is conducted by the Search Committee in consultation with the Diocese of West Missouri through the Transition Missioner, Fr. Chas Marks. The search must comply with all Diocesan and Episcopal Church requirements.

#### Phase One

The first phase of the search process requires the Search Committee to do a self-study of the congregation using a survey or other methodology to discover the strengths and weaknesses of the parish and, most importantly, what skillset and personal qualities the members of Resurrection desire in their new Rector. The survey results will be presented to the congregation and time will be provided for feedback.

Based on that self-study, the Search Committee will create a document called the 'Parish Profile'. This document is designed to be a narrative, which tells the story of our Parish, its demographics, needs, community environment, history, vision, dreams, and mission. The Search Committee will also complete a portfolio for the Episcopal Church Office of Transition Ministries.

Once the Parish Profile and all supplemental documents are completed, they will be brought first to the Vestry for approval, and then sent to the Diocese for comment and approval. The Search Committee will then publish the Parish Profile (posted on Resurrection's website) and the portfolio published in the Office of Transition Ministries' database.

#### Phase Two

The second phase of the search process begins when the Search Committee begins to accept resumes and other information provided by clergy candidates who are interested in the Rector position at the Church of the Resurrection.

Information about the Rector position at Resurrection will be available in The Episcopal Church database accessible to clergy in transition who are searching for new positions. Information will also be shared through the network of transition officers in the Dioceses of The Episcopal Church. All potential candidates must apply through Father Chas Marks, the designated representative at the Diocese of West Missouri as our Transition Missioner. Likewise, any referral of names of potential candidates must be made through Father Marks. The Diocese will perform any required initial screening and will forward names of qualified candidates to the Search Committee. The Search Committee will develop and implement a process for reviewing candidates through reference checks, telephone interviews, visits, and interviews with final candidates. The Search Committee will also develop a uniform system of rating and ranking candidates.

Once a final candidate has been selected by the Search Committee and interviewed by the Bishop of the Diocese, the name of that candidate will be recommended by the Search Committee to the Vestry for a further interview with them and the Vestry will make the final decision to accept the recommendation and the Bishop will issue the call to the new Rector.
